## CASE HISTORY #20,000

MUSIC:

UP 10 SECONDS AND UNDER THROUGH

ANNOUNCER:

We give you CASE HISTORY #20,000 - the story of one child - the story of thousands. We ask you to come with us to a small country 6,000 miles away - an old country, yet a new one - to PALESTINE.

MUSIC:

UP BIG 10 SECONDS AND OUT

VOICES UP AND UNDER THROUGH

ANNOUNCER:

A ship has just docked in the harbor of Heifa. Newly arrived immigrants are streaming down the gangplanks. At one end, a group of child refugees, dressed in rage and clinzing to their mitiful possessions are being ushered into the office of the Youth Aliyah representative. Youth Aliyah which has been maintaining and educating child refugees in Palestine since 1933, is about to reach out and care for its 20,000th child - a young girl. On her left arm can be seen a concentration camp number branded into her skin in bright blue numerals. She has a pale face...deep, staring eyes. A woman beckens to her. She moves forward slowly, fear and distruct in every movement....

SOUND:

DOOR CLOSES

VOICES OUT

REFRESENTATIVE:

Shelon. Tell me, my dear, what is your name?

CHILD:

(PAUSE) - Henneh.

REFERENMENTATIVE:

Shelon, Hennah, Where do you come from?

CHILDS

Palana.

REPRESENTATIVE:

How old are you Hannah?

CHILD

Twelve.

REPRESENTATIVE.

What are the names of your father and nother?

CHILD:

They were Benjamin and Eather.

REFRESENTATIVE:

Do you know where they are now?

CHILD:

They are dead.

REPRESENTATIVE:

(PAUSE) - How do you know, Hannah? Perhaps they are lost. Perhaps we can find them for you.

CHILD:

They are dead. I saw it with my own eyes. (PAUSE) I was nine when the Germans came - with guns and tanks. They hit us. They made us go into a ghetto with electric fonces. I and my daddy and my mummy and my sister and my three brothers lived in a dark cellar where it was always wet. One day a bus came and they made us go on it and they took us outside the town. Everybody screemed when we saw the big open grave. I jumped out of the bus. They caught me and whipped me and put me back. They said, take off your clothes. And if we were slow, they ripped them off. Then they pushed us.

REPRESENTATIVE:

Yes?

CHILD:

Well, I was the only one who escaped.

REPRESENTATIVE:

How did you escape, Hannah?

CHILD:

I went up the sides and ran away.

REPRESENTATIVE:

Where did you go?

CHILD:

I went from village to village but nobody wanted to take me in.

Then a farmer thought I was Polish so he took me in. But later some people came and they made me stand in the light and said I was a Jew and they called the police. The police took me to a forest. But they did something funny. They kept looking for their bullets and then they said: "Stay here, we need more bullets." Maybe they wanted me to run away. I ran and came to the Czech frontier. Some Czechs took me in and I worked for them cleaning and washing and cooking. And one day we heard that

CHILD:

(COMTINUING) children were ming to Palestine. I found them.

But don't ask me how ... I won't tell you.

REPRESENTATIVE:

We're glad you found them, Hannah. We're glad because they brought you home. In Palestine you will find many friends who

will help you. And you will so to school. Don't cry.

CHILD:

(STIFLING SOBS) I can't believe I'm in Palestine yet. I haven't been to school for four years and I have forgotten how to read

and write. Could I learn again?

REPRESENTATI VE:

Yes, you will learn meny new things, child.

CHILD:

It hurts me so about my daddy and my nother and my brothers and my little sister. But do you think ...

REPRESENTATIVE:

Yes?

CHILD:

Well - that the children who came with me, with Youth Aliyah, ere

like having brothers and sisters ... in a way?

MUSIC:

UP 5 SECONDS AND UNDER THROUGH

REPRESENTATIVE:

Yos, Hennah. Youth Aliyah will be brother and sister and father and nother to you. Youth Aliyah will see that you grow up to be a strong, healthy women, that you learn again and play again and arehappy again in Falestine.

MUSIC:

UP 15 SECONDS AND OUT

AMNOUNCER:

This story is based on a report received by Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America, the official representative of Youth Aliyah in the United States. Hadassah is now engaged in a nationwide campaign to raise \$1,400,000 for Youth Aliyah which will help to maintain and educate 20,000 Hannah's in Palestine, plus the additional thousands who will be entering soon.
